Northside Elementary receives donation from local Altrusa group

DECATUR -- A local nonprofit group was at Northside Elementary on April 19 to give a monetary donation and other items to the students at the school.

"Our particular Altrusa International organization has children's literacy as a focus," McCauley said. "That is why we come out to Decatur Elementary once a month when we can and have a book shop or a free book giveaway to all of the children here.
