4 members would prefer to travel back to the past and 6 members preferred to travel forward.



With cake, balloons and carnations, Our club turned 25!!




With a gardening theme our **New Club Officers** have been installed!

Altrusa provides financial support, donates items for the children's prize drawings, and volunteers time to help children with activities each week.

\$\$\$ The **Proposed Operating Budget** -\$7160.06, and the **Proposed Foundation Budget**-\$19,120.00 were presented. It was proposed to accept the budgets, they were approved.
